## **New Business**

- b. Blue Water Club is requiring each of the attendees at their club events sign a covid tracing form. This is not optional, you must sign it or you will not be allowed to participate in any event.
- c. The main gate at Blue Water will now be locked at all times per club policy. We will need to provide a person at the gate to allow entry to event.
- d. Discussion ensued about manning the gate. Motion made by Norm Gibson to "appropriate up to \$100.00 per day to hire a person to open and close the gate". Motion passed.
- e. Mike Zandarski will try to get club members to perform the task. If he is unable to, the skirmish director is responsible for providing coverage at the gate. It should not be up to only the host teams to provide coverage, this is something all participant teams can take part in.
- f. It was then decided that at the first Blue Water Skirmish only, the skirmish director will coordinate coverage to man the gate. This topic will be revisited at a future commanders meeting during the season

# Open discussion from the floor

- a. Norm suggested that shoot fees be raised to compensate the clubs for range fees as well as making up for less shooter participant.
- b. Motion by Bruce Miller to "raise all participation fees to \$8.00 per event." Motion failed.
- c. Motion by Bob Hubbard, 7<sup>th</sup> Wisconsin to "raise all participation fees to \$10.00 per event." Motion passed.
- d. Norm stated that the region has excess metal targets and that we should sell them in sets of 5 to make the storage spaces less cluttered.
- e. Motion by Norm Gibson to "sell excess metal targets in sets of 5 for \$25.00 per set." Motion passed.
- f. The sets will consist of the following: Clovers, Diamonds, Rectangles, Stars, and Acorn. If interested contact Norm, and paying by check whenever possible is preferred.
